QUALIFICATIONS TO APPLY

- High School Diploma or G.E.D
- Minimum of 21 years of age
- A current, unrestricted Colorado driver's license within one (1) month of hire
- Proof of safe driving record
- Current State of Colorado EMT-Basic or Paramedic certification or; National Registry EMT or Paramedic and the ability to obtain Colorado State certification (within one (1) month of hire)
- Ability to pass a criminal background check
- Ability to pass a drug test
- Ability to pass a psychological evaluation

PHYSICAL AGILITY TEST

- All candidates will be required to complete a physical agility test at Academy completion as a condition of employment.

REQUIREMENTS POST EMPLOYMENT

- All Firefighter EMTs and Fire Medic/Paramedic recruits, regardless of prior experience, will be required to attend a Career Fire Academy
- Certification at State of Colorado Firefighter I and Hazardous Material Operations level (obtain within six months of hire)
- NIMS I-100, IS -700 - NWCG 130/190
- Complete LFPD Field Instruction Program (within one (1) year of hire)
- IV certification (within one (1) year of hire)
- Meet minimum annual fitness and physical requirements
- Certified child car seat technician (within first year of hire)
- Maintain a current, unrestricted Colorado driver's license
- EMT's may be required to obtain Colorado EMT-Paramedic certification at a later date at the sole discretion of the Fire Chief
- May be required to obtain State of Colorado Hazardous Material Technician at a later date at the sole discretion of the Fire Chief
